## AROUND OUR PARISH

Deacon Reggie Bollich presents "Jesus at Bethsaida: The Risen Christ by the Sea" on Monday March 21 of Holy Week in the St Jules Church Hall at 6:30 PM. Deacon Reggie has been visiting and excavating archeological sites in the Middle East for 34 years. In 2015 he completed his 14th sojourn in the Holy Land. During the last 20 years he helped unearth the lost city of Bethsaida, a recently discovered New Testament site located on the northern shore of the Sea of Galilee. In 1996, while digging to a depth of 8 feet beneath the lost city of Bethsaida, he discovered the Old Testament royal city of ancient Geshur. At the time of Jesus, Bethsaida was a fishing harbor on the Sea of Galilee. The New Testament records Bethsaida as the hometown of the apostles Peter, Andrew, and Philip. It is also believed to be the hometown of Zebedee and his sons James and John. Jesus undoubtedly lived with his disciples at Bethsaida during his ministry in Galilee.
