Just a reminder! Divine Mercy Sunday is this Sunday, 4/23/17. In her Diary, St. Faustina records a special promise given to her by Jesus. He told her to communicate it to the whole world: *“My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy (699). I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy (1109).”* To receive these graces, the only condition is to receive Holy Communion worthily on Divine Mercy Sunday (or the Vigil celebration) by making a good confession and staying in the state of grace and trusting in His Divine Mercy.

The second Collection next weekend will be for Catholic Home Missions. This is the name for dioceses and parishes in the US, including its territories and former territories, which cannot provide basic pastoral services to Catholics without outside help. Basic pastoral services include Mass and sacraments, religious education, and ministry training for priests, deacons, religious sisters and lay people. The church is poorly established in many parts of our country. Please be generous.
